Gulf Coast Educators FCU Ranked in Top 100 Best Performing Credit Unions

Pasadena, TX: Gulf Coast Educators Federal Credit Union has once again made the list for S&P Global Market Intelligence’s annual rankings of the [Top 100 Best-Performing Credit Unions for 2022](#). This is the third consecutive year that the credit union has made the award-winning data insight provider’s list. GCEFCU is ranked sixty-sixth on the list of top performing credit unions in the nation.

Each year, [S&P Global Market Intelligence](#) scores credit unions based on five metrics. The scores are then measured against the industry mean and ranked accordingly. The five scoring metrics are listed below:

- Member growth
- Total number of loans per member
- Net worth as a percentage of total assets
- Delinquent loans as a percentage of total loans
- Return on average assets



Criteria for the rankings included credit unions with more than \$100 million in total assets and a net worth ratio of at least 7% as of December 31, 2022. Based on this criteria, 1,797 credit unions qualified for the ranking.
